



Science of Sherbet – ages 5-12

Explore the sometimes-explosive effects of acid-base reactions to discover how sherbet tingles your tongue and make your own to take home. Taste the science of sherbet.

In this workshop we explore the somewhat explosive effects of acid-base reactions through carbon dioxide balloons and film canister or yoghurt tub rockets. Try a safe and delicious acid base reaction in your mouth by making some sherbet to take home.

Rat Trap Racers and Hovercraft

Discover the fundamentals of vehicular movement using rat trap racers and compare this to a model hovercraft you take home! Ready, set, go!

In this workshop we explore how motor vehicles work and apply the same principles to create 'vehicles' of our own. Use a rat trap as an engine in a race against your mates and make a model hovercraft to take home.







